But for us the date has a different significance.

On this date, 193 years ago, John Constable stood in the village of West Blatchington and created this sketch of the Windmill serving Court Farm. It is a pen & ink watercolour clearly dated in the top left-hand corner.

The original belongs to a private collector in the US but the Mill has several prints on display in the museum and on sale in the shop. Constable, as a son of a miller, knew about mills and sketched many around Brighton, where he stayed in a cottage on the half-built outskirts of the resort with his young family from 1824-1828 There will be galleries of photos celebrating events plus promotion of events planned in the future. A page is also dedicated to the Friends, where you can download a copy of this Newsletter. The contacts page allows you to communicate with us. Indeed it would be wonderful if you could use this to give us feedback about the website so it may continue to develop and improve.
